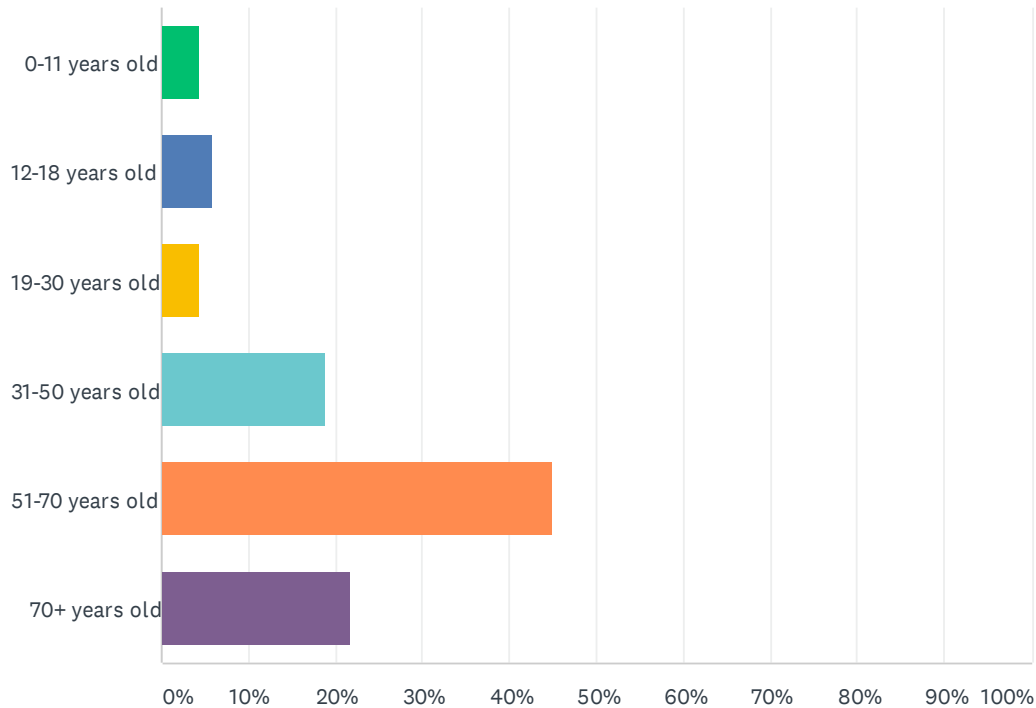


Q1 How old are you?

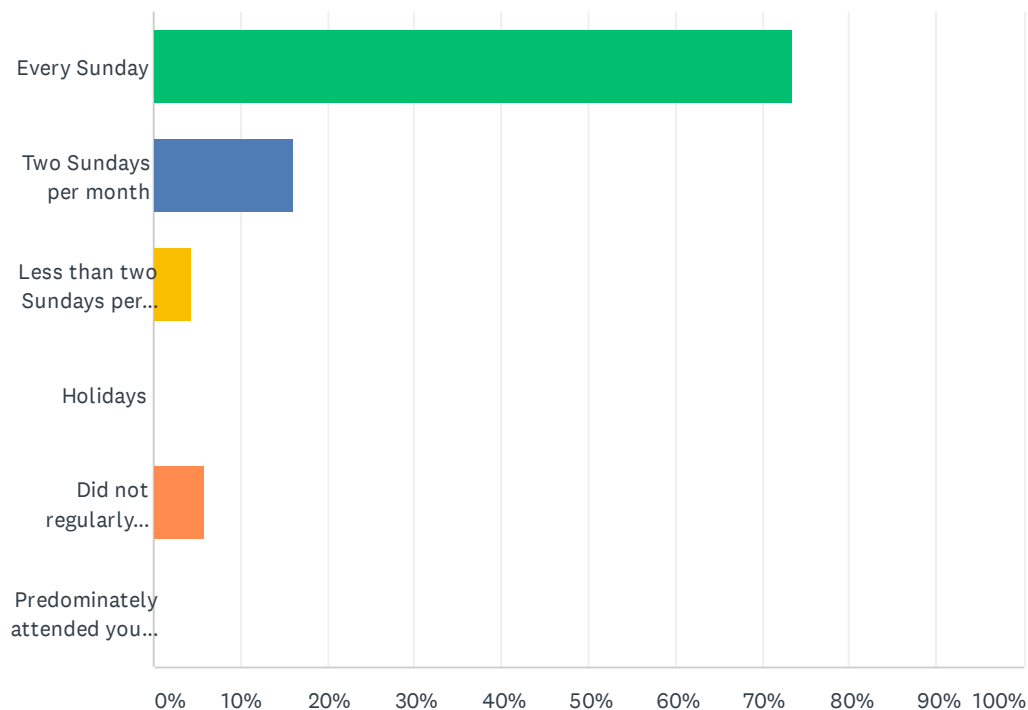

Q2 When church was meeting, how often would you attend?

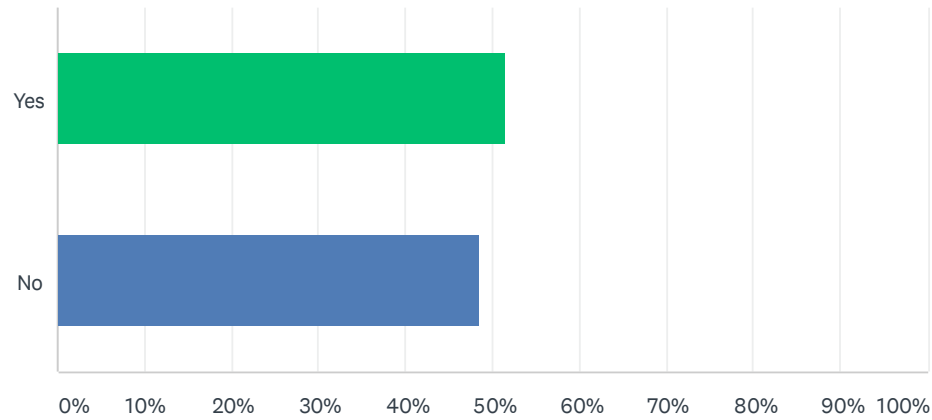

Q3 Do you use the church Facebook to keep current?

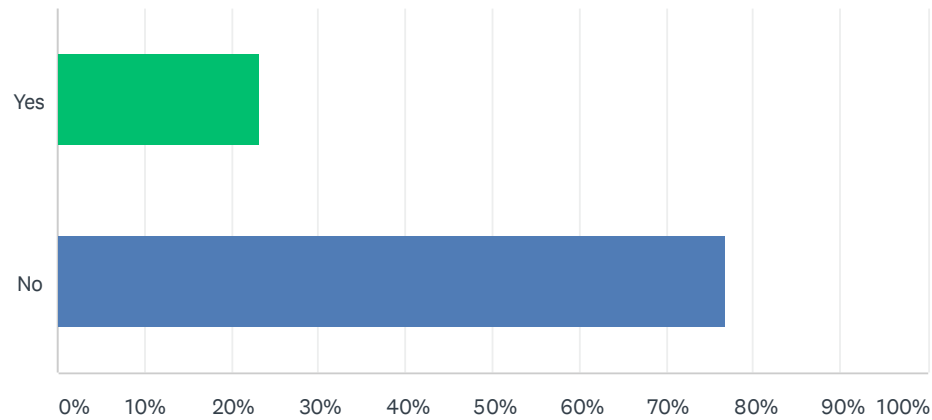

Q4 Do you use the church Google calendar page on the website to keep current?

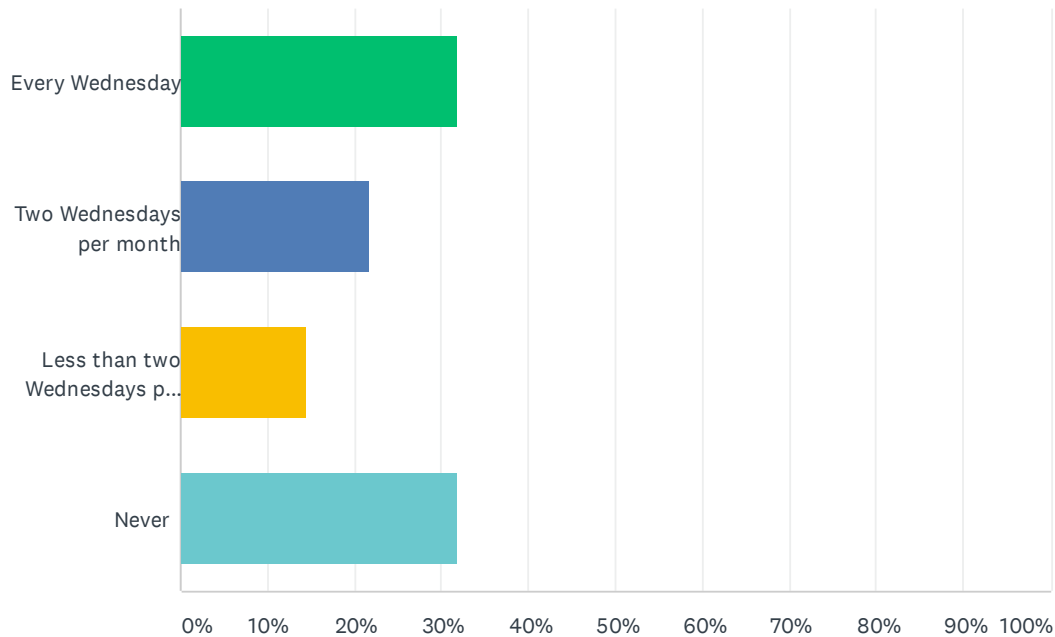

Q5 How often do you listen to the Wednesday meditations online (through the ORPC website, Facebook page or YouTube)?

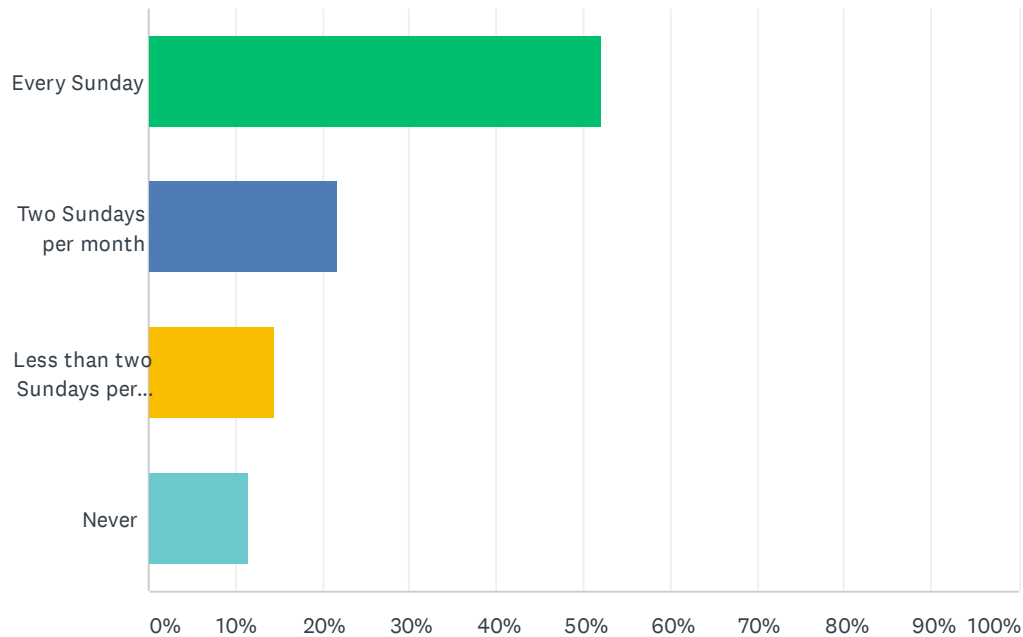

Q6 How often do you listen to the Sunday sermons online (through the ORPC website, Facebook page or YouTube)?

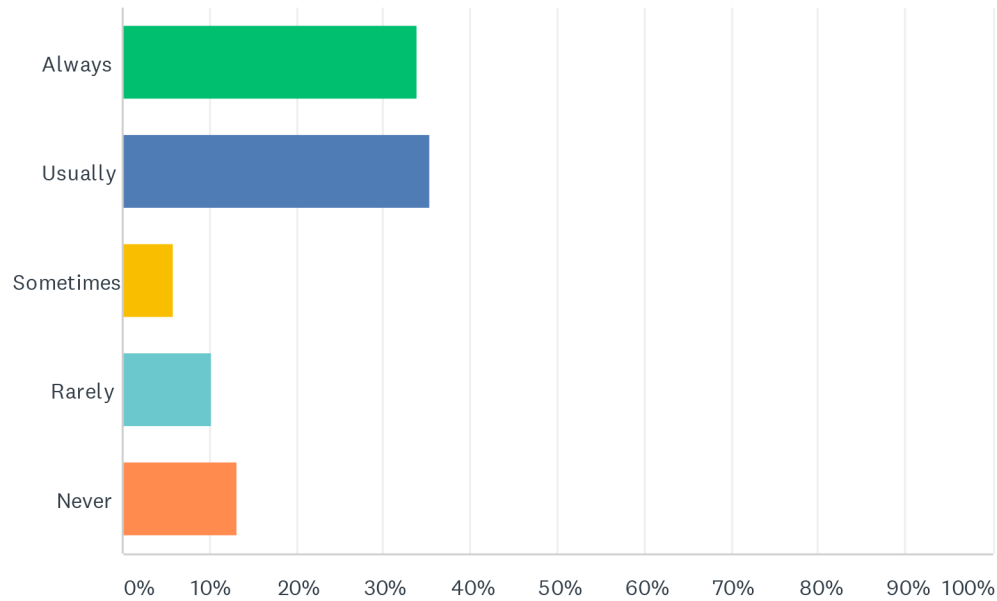

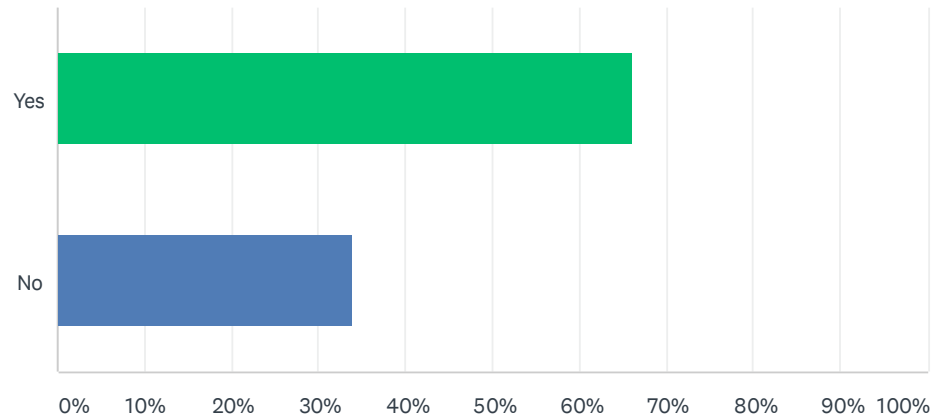

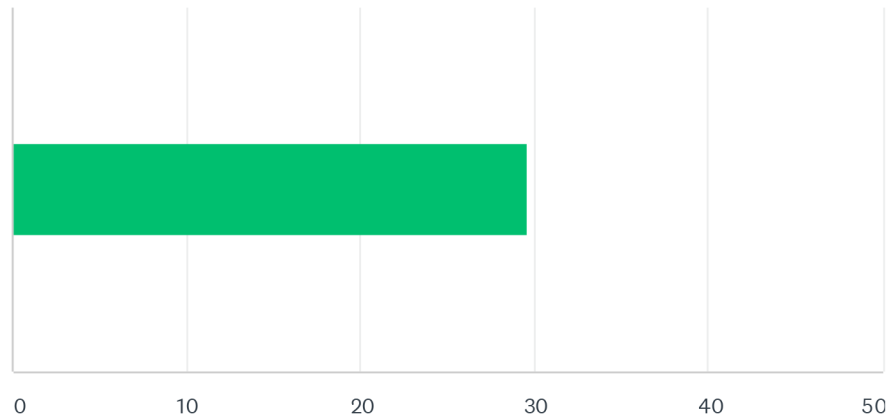

This means that even if a person has a strong immune system and/or is vaccinated for a contagen (of which we don't have a vaccine yet); they are still susceptible to get the disease simply because the smount of virus/pathogen carriers is so high/in such close quarters. This has happened repeatedly withing the Jewish community (Mumps) on the East coast in recent years. Specifically at the boys schools because even though the majoriry of boys are vaccinated against mumps; they spend approx ~7 hours a day in study groups of 4-6 boys for school and Torah lessons. 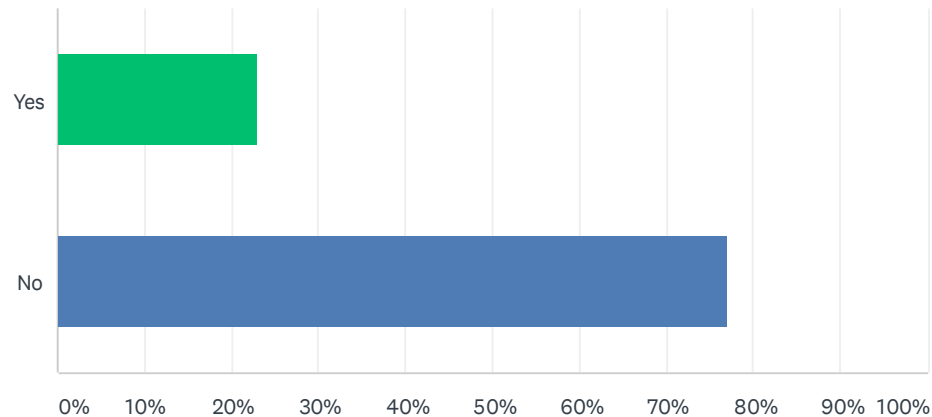

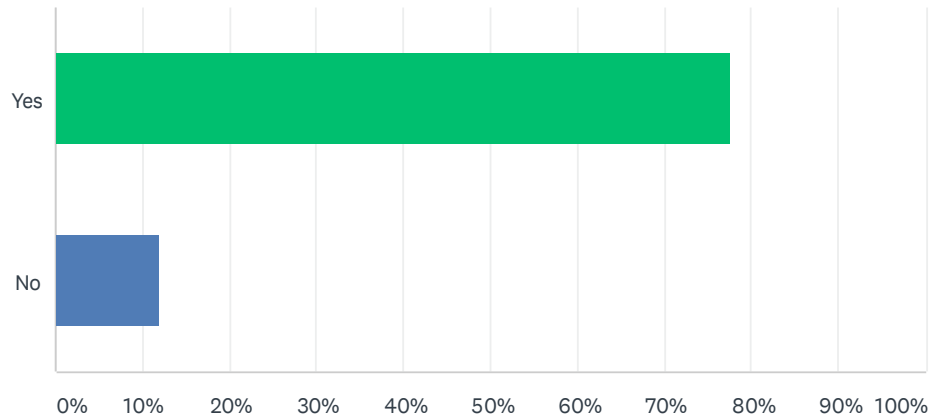

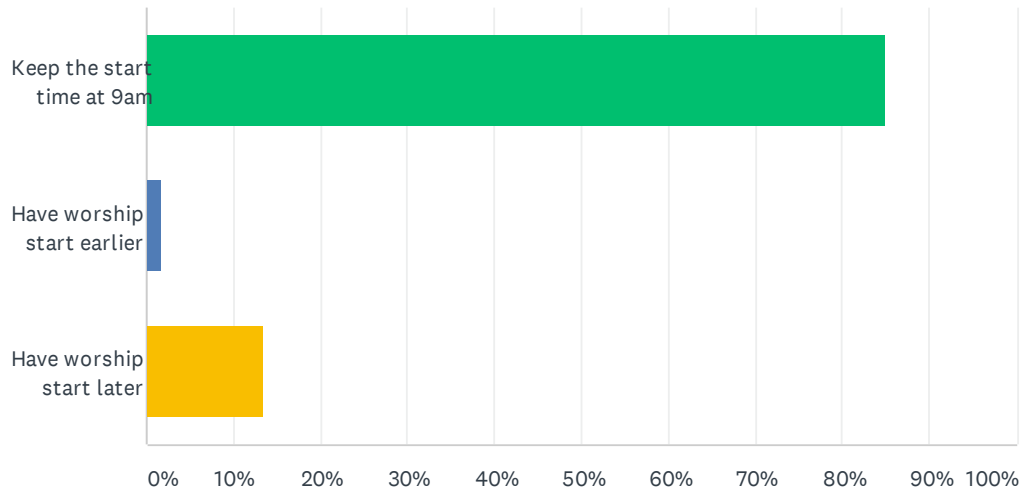

Q16 What time would you like worship to begin?

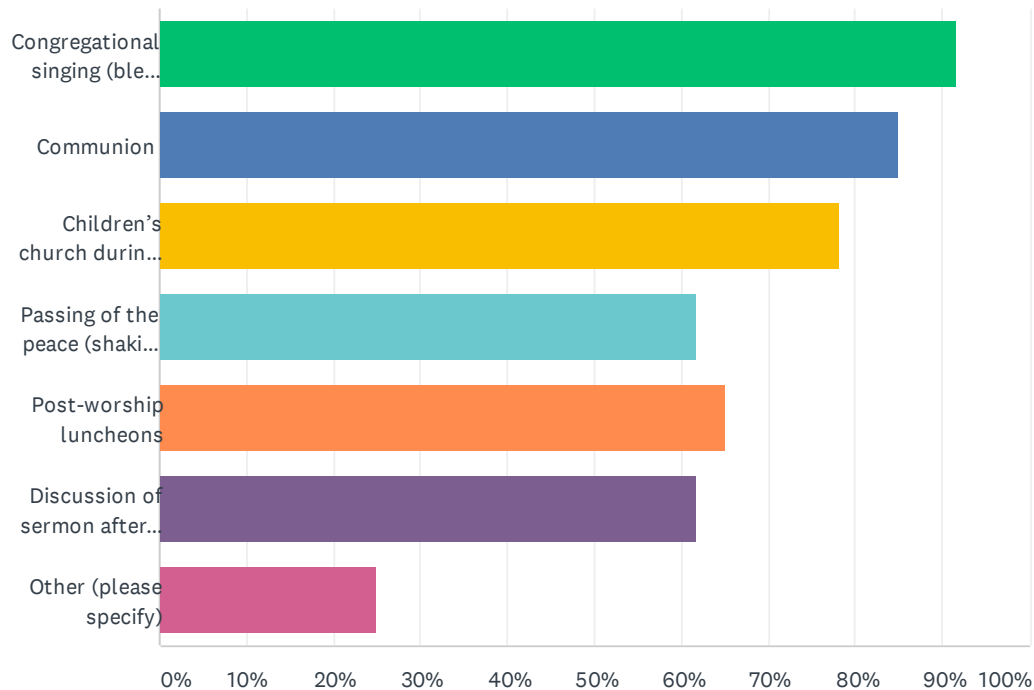
